

Attendance



If you wish to keep a check on your child's attendance you can do so via the Arbor app. Please be advised that arriving at school on time every day is very important. The children start their mornings with a fun phonics lesson. The attendance target for every child is 97%, although we do understand that children can become ill. If your child is ill, please leave a detailed message on our school voicemail before 8.30am, every day that your child is absent. As part of the government requirement we will be sending out regular emails to those whose attendance drops below the required percentage and for those who are persistently absent.

Year One

In Year 1 we have continued to focus on sentence structure in our English lessons. This has helped improve letter formation, handwriting and sentences are beginning to start with a capital letter and end in a full stop. We have been doing this through a lovely story book called "the Way Back Home" by Oliver Jeffers. After we explored this story in more detail, the children finished the unit by writing their own adventure for the characters from the story. In our Maths, we focused on subtracting within 10 and then moved on to learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We were very proud of how strong children's understanding of shape was.

For our wider curriculum subjects, such as Science, we have been learning about materials and their properties. We have been working scientifically to explore a range of materials and their uses. In our Geography and History, we explored the local park where we found many human and physical features, as well as looking at the history of Kettering. In our DT session, the children have been exploring how to make a hand puppet using a range of joining methods including sewing. The children made prototypes, which they evaluated to improve on their design and making skills. For RE, we have been learning about the Christmas story as well as Hanukkah.

We hope that the children in Year 1 have a fantastic Christmas break and we look forward to all the fantastic learning that will be taking place next term. Have a lovely Christmas.

Year Two

Year 2 have had a fantastic term! In our Science lessons, we've learnt all about materials and their purposes, doing a hunt of the school to see what materials have been used around the school building. In computing we've learnt how to take photos both landscape and portrait and how to take photos properly from different viewpoints - we especially had lots of fun experimenting with selfies! We worked incredibly hard in English and absolutely loved writing about the animated story 'My Christmas Star'. In Geography we have looked at comparing two islands in the UK, the Isle of Coll in Scotland and the Isle of Wight. We've had a huge focus on our Times Table Rockstars this term and it's been amazing to see the children so excited to learn their tables! Maths has also seen a weekly introduction in each class of 'Maths Whizz' where the children have their own logins and access this on a laptop. Logins will be sent home for this soon.


There is no need to call, just drop in to find a safe place with hope and comfort and find your pathway to recovery.
